It stems from the fact that the Doctors and Nurses allegedly were not under the control of the Military when they worked to save the lives of our Boys during the Vietnam War. We can scratch our

heads and wonder why, when these young men and women unselfishly gave their time and expertise to assist our sick and



wounded in such appalling conditions. It seems that many of the Civilian Medical team suffer from war related illnesses similar to our Vets. In the United States of America it is now accepted that Doctors and Nurses who served in Vietnam suffer from post-traumatic stress syndrome with the explanation that they have seen more death and suffering than the troops.

As former members of the WRAAC we know how special Army and Civilian Medics are.

It is time to cut through the red tape and accept responsibly for these heroes who need our help and respect now.

# More Cut Backs Forcast Reforming and Rationalising

In a leaked draft of the Gillard Government's 2013 white paper it's reported that several Military bases and ARMY Reserve depots face possible closure in the latest rush to save money. This is due in part to a \$5.5 Billion cut to Defence spending. The severity of the cuts will certainly impact on

enlistment applications to Reserve Units as prospective Reservists attempt to juggle work, family and service commitments all with the burden of extra travel time. Imagine having to drive for another 90minutes after work to attend a Parade night. The Defence Minister must let us know soon which bases are safe and those marked for the chopping block.

The pressure not to sell a prime piece of real estate such as the depot in the leafy suburb of upmarket Hawthorn (Melbourne) would be too much for the bean counters. As former members of 8/3 WRAAC CO would know, how many units were developed on the former site of the classic Drill Hall in Highbury Road Kew.

Short term gains are not always the answer!
